

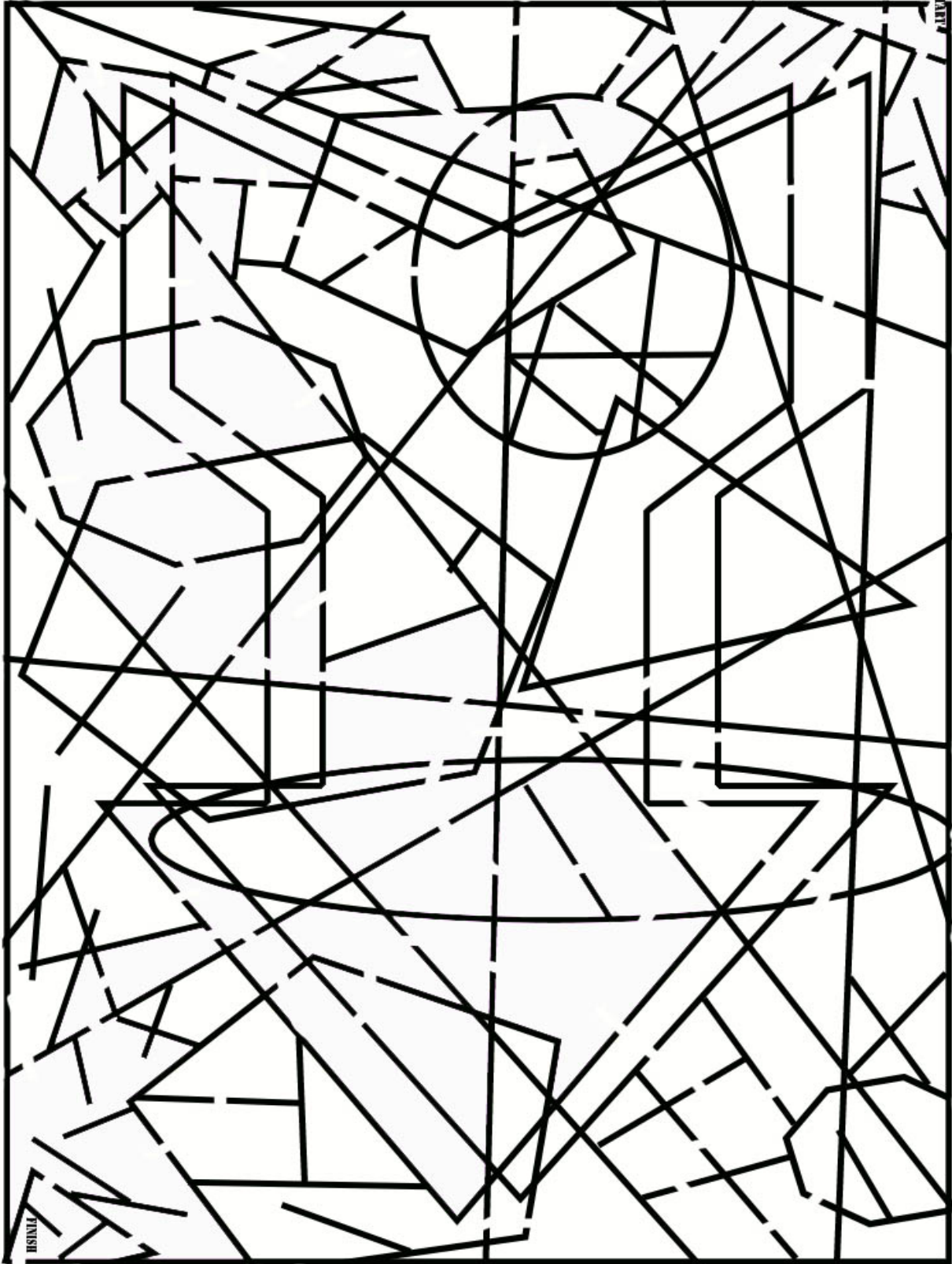
KIDS FOR TORAH

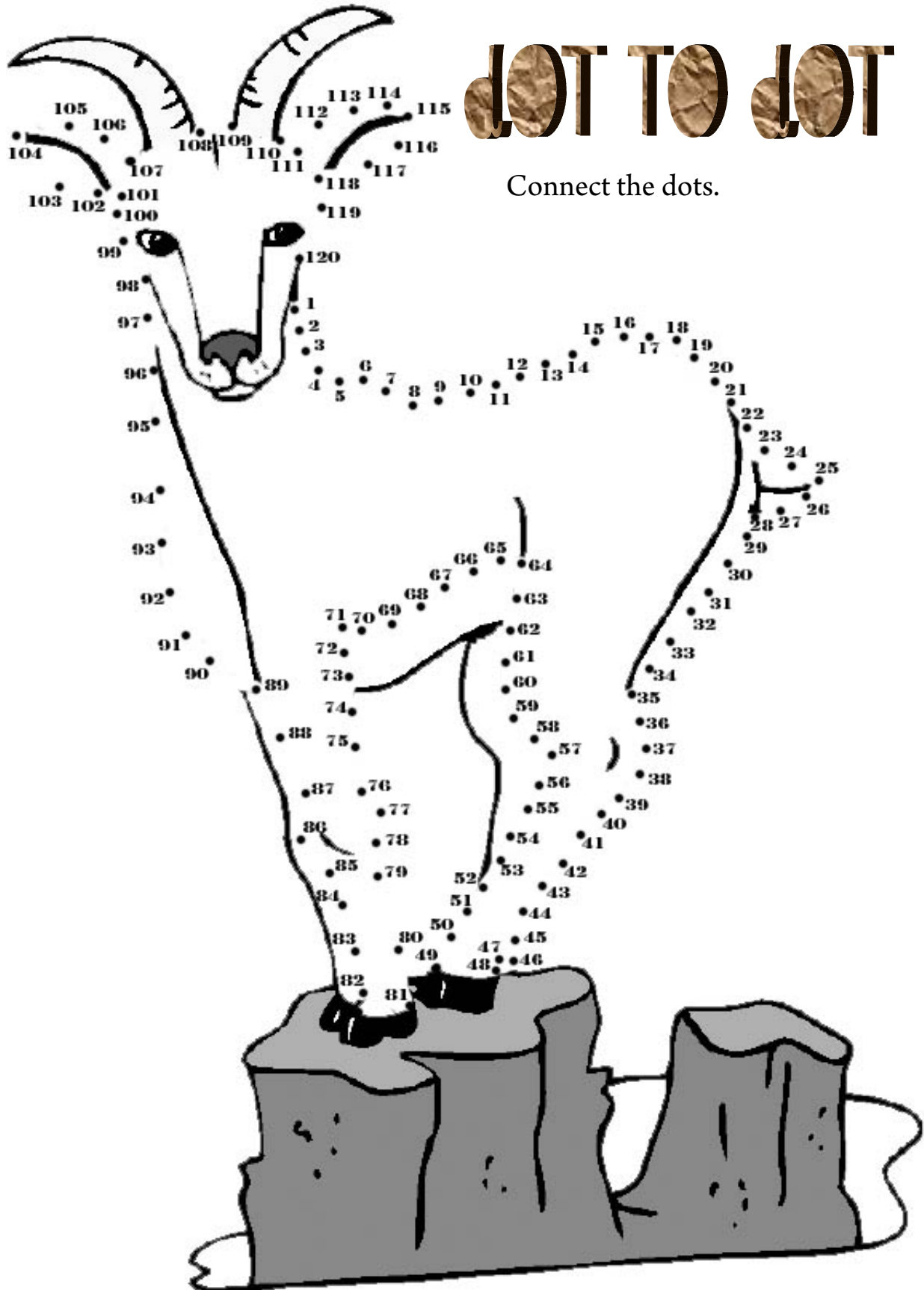
